- 1 - **WOWSPACE** 114 Vinal St, downtown Wittenberg. Admire this elegant 1886 building donated to WOW by Joe and Kathy Gwidt in 2006 for activities of the Walls of Wittenberg, Inc.
- 2 - **“Optical Foolery”** Alan Clough, Wittenberg, WI, teases our eyes and sensibilities with the mural on the north wall of the WOWSPACE, 114 Vinal Street.
- 3 - **“In Our Dreams”** Tony Vanderheyden of Appleton, WI, created a whimsical beach scene of the dreams we have during frigid winter nights. Wall of Resch’s Lanes Bowling Alley facing Webb Street.
- 4 - **Art Park:** “Soaring Spirit”, magnificent eagle sculpture, Sara Balbin, Drummond, WI; 3 “Posing Blocks”, “Recycled Rising Sun” & “Pavilion”, all by Miles Amorelli, DePere, WI; “We Move with Conviction”, brilliant blue abstract form, Nathan Hatch, Sister Bay, WI; “Zoe”, playful bronze dog, Jim Budish, Highland Park, IL.
- 5 - **“Help Is On The Way”** Alicia Rheal, Madison, WI, documents two key groups in our community; volunteer firefighters and emergency medical technicians. North wall of Esker’s Town and Country Hardware Webb St.
- 6 - **“Spirit of Wittenberg Still Sings”** Elementary and middle school students, with the direction of Connie & Tim Friesen, Lakewood, WI, created and painted this mural on the south wall of the Middle School, Webb St.
- 7 - **“The Community Quilt”** 100+ area residents painted the mural on the Middle School’s east wall, Webb St.
- 8 - **“ALL ABOARD! ALL ABOARD!”** Andy Goretski, Tomahawk, WI, has brought the Chicago Northwestern passenger and freight trains back to Wittenberg on the wall of Low’s storage shed facing Howard Street.
- 9 - **“A Tribute to Gus and Ann”** Gus & Ann’s Restaurant is immortalized on the walls of Lisa’s Sweet Shoppe Bakery and Catering, corner of Vinal and Howard by Ram Rojas, Door County, WI.
- 10 - **“The Nuts and Bolts of It”** Andy Goretski, Tomahawk, WI, depicts the scene of a 1910 hardware store on the east wall of True Value Hardware, Cherry St.
- 11 - **“Friends”** Kelly Meredith, Butternut, WI, created portraits of area residents with their furry friends: cats to cows. North, South and West gables of the Wittenberg Veterinary Clinic, Vinal Street.
- 12 - **“Stars and Stripes Forever”** Beth Koeppel, Wittenberg, WI, adds a row of scintillating stamps to our U.S. Post Office, south wall, Howard St.
- 13 - **“The Big Picture”** The walls of Hanke’s Super Valu, Reed Street, explode with color celebrating the agricultural history of our area by The Painted Ladies, Shannon Becker and Alicia Rheal of Madison, WI.
- 14 - **“Foundations of Faith”** Early and current churches of the community, sheltered by a guardian angel, grace the north wall of the Homme Home, Reed Street by Ram Rojas, Door County, WI.
- 15 - **“Color Find-ness”** by Jenn Bushman & Matt Duckett, LaCrosse, WI, employs swirling complementary circles, buried imagery, and the tools of eye care. On the southwest wall of Dr. Goga’s Eye Clinic, Webb St.
- 16 - **“Rack ‘em Up”** Today the pool balls click not only inside Klinker’s Bar and Grill but also on the west and north walls outside! Admire the talented work of Tony Vanderheyden, Appleton, WI, located on Vinal Street.
- 17 - **“Circle of Life”** Anthony Gauthier, Wittenberg, WI, tells us stories of WI Indians, the Menominee creation story, a pow-wow grand entrance and clan totems on the south wall of Esker’s Town and Country Hardware, Webb St.
- 18 - **“Wittenberg Welcomes You”** Reynaldo Hernandez, Milwaukee, WI, designed a turn-of-the-century saloon scene for the Village Inn, corner of Webb and Vinal Streets.
- 19 - **“Restoration”** Alan Clough, Wittenberg, WI, whose trompe l’oeil work adds to the law offices of Ashenbrenner, Woods, Schmid, Chereskin and Sloma at 111 Vinal St.
